



THE GOLDEN STATE OF THE WCC

nce a small group of friends putting on neighborhood tournaments, the WCC is now a rising force in the world of professional cornhole.

To be honest, our early days of playing cornhole on the West Coast were fun, but finding other players interested in playing any sort of organized cornhole was a bit difficult. There were no preexisting groups or organizations to turn to. In fact, most people we spoke to knew nothing of the sport. Mentioning cornhole to others would often result in a laugh or snicker. It was usually due to the name, but some were underestimating the skill level it would take

to master the game.

Our group of friends had already realized that this can be more than a backyard game. We embraced that it required a great deal of skill, patience and practice to become a consistently good player. It was our desire to play often and compete at any level that compelled us to start a group of our own that would run small events and tournaments. In 2011, West Coast Cornhole was born.

For more than a year, we held the typical backyard gatherings and some very small tournaments. Then one day Ken Jones told me about several YouTube videos he had watched and the throwing techniques and strategies he

had learned. That is when I first heard about the American Cornhole Organization. After contacting American Cornhole and speaking with Frank Geers on a few occasions, Ken was offered a Certified Official position to help grow the sport in the west and we were truly off and running. As our organization grew, we ran more tournaments and our players improvement was becoming evident.

In 2013, we held our first ACO State Championships. Ken Jones won the singles title and together we took the doubles title. Each match was competitive and we could tell the top players were here to create a legacy. At the end of the season Ken and I attended

our first World Championships. Attending the worlds, meeting players, and seeing the level of play in person was amazing. This was another turning point for WCC. What we learned from the Worlds allowed us to get even more players involved and our organization continued to thrive.

In the coming years, we brought countless numbers of players and a few CO's onboard, promoting the sport any way we could. As our player base expanded, it allowed us to promote bigger and bigger tournaments. Ken and I now run the Northern California area, and hope to soon reach into the southern CA market and rock the Cali cornhole world!

added or a place where we spend some time on the phone with those who make the ACO tick, it's also a place where we want to be as interactive as we can with you. Whether you're a seasoned ACO



Within a few short months the Hillbilly Bandits began playing every day and joined two leagues. Korey Harkins, Alan Polson, Tyler Polson, and Trever Schramm found their passion when they joined the Suwanee and Duluth cornhole leagues. Their very first year – within a few months of the formation

-the group became the champions of the Duluth League in 2016. Wanting to pursue their interests and continue the competitive streak, they sought advice from Frank Geers, Eric Hinerman, and Katherine Kennedy. Shortly after, all four men became members of the American Cornhole Organization.

Alan Polson and Korey Harkins are now certified officials who can host regional tournaments. In order to host tour-


naments, there must be an association; hence Alan and the other member's creation of the North Georgia Cornhole Association.

SKILLCON

A CHAMPIONSHIP OF TALENTS THAT

YOU MIGHT NEVER HAVE IMAGINED

ave you ever felt as if you leapt into an alternate universe? A place in which dart boards are a story high and soccer balls are used for darts? To your left there are jugglers who double as linebackers smashing into each other. To your right, you see you and your friends when you were kids, flipping half-filled water bottles on to the table, trying to see if you could turn it into some feat of acrobatic glory. This is the Fusion Universe, where sports and athletic feats of all kinds are melded together into mind blowing athletic competitions. Unlike alternate universes that are depicted in theoretical physics, this one is tangible and it began like many revolutions within our history, fueled by the desire of one person who wanted to do things differently.

From learning juggling basics when he was a kid in 1986, to winning low profile competitions, Jason Garfield pushed his body to extremes in order to expand the boundaries of fringe athletic competitions. He was determined to carry the idea of athletic competition to new places no one had ever dreamt of going. The further he progressed, adapting more and more complex skill sets, the further he pushed the sport until finally he broke through the glass ceiling and began producing sport juggling competition programs for ESPN. However, that was only the beginning. Now, Garfield has gathered the greatest, most diverse athletically skilled competitors in the United States for an elite tournament called SkillCon and the Moxie Games. Hang on Corhnole nation because you're not going to believe your eyes.

SkillCon and the Moxie Games showcase skills

and sports that range from combat juggling, martial arts, volleyball, pool trick shot competitions, cornhole, bottle flipping, yo-yo, foot darts, eSports, powerlifting, bodybuilding, and the list continues to grow. As the parent company, Moxie Games provides support and exposure for event organizers across the country and their athletes for local and regional competitions. Their goal is to help competitors reach the height of their sport, and bring them together in a culmination of world champion crowning events at SkillCon, which is being held this December 15 - 17 in Las Vegas, Nevada.

"Part of what we do is to provide learning opportunities that develop physical and cognitive skills, entertainment and team experiences for kids of all ages through partnerships with athletes, social media influencers, and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) organizations including FIRST Nevada, Mad Science, and the Macgyver Academy."

Garfield continued that their goal is to reward all Moxie Games athletes and event organizers for their dedication and perseverance by providing a medium where excellence in these outsidethe-box-sports can be recognized and showcased to the world. Much like the American Cornhole Organization, where our approach is always to help

our players reach their full potential, Garfield and his team at Moxie want to create unprecedented opportunities for those who excel at these compelling skills and support

their ambitious event organizers, breaking down the barriers preventing them from achieving their goals.

SkillCon and the Moxie Game will be held this year at the Rio

Hotel in Las Vegas. Now in their fourth year, the ACO leadership is thrilled to be a part of the SkillCon ultimate skills competition for a fourth year in a row. This will be the largest event to date with unprecedented interest from previous and developing broadcast partners and social media influencers. The race is on to see who can take down Scripps at future tournaments.


